		08.02.2017	1.0 West Bengal State Electricity Distribution Company Limited (WBSEDCL), a deemed distribution licensee as per provision of the Electricity Act 2003 (here in after referred to be as "Act") and engaged in the business of generation, distribution and supply of electricity has submitted an application for issuance of order under regulation 8.10 of the West Bengal Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions of Tariff) Regulations, 2011, as amended (in short Tariff Regulations).				
			2.0 It has been submitted by WBSEDCL in their application that the Commission vide its letters dated 19.06.2015 and 18.04.2016 requested WBSEDCL to send a proposal to resolve the disparity in power tariff between Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC) and				
2 - S			WBSEDCL. The Department of Power and NES, Government of West Bengal, also vide letters dated 14.03.2016 and 08.04.2016 requested WBSEDCL to submit a report regarding the issue mentioned by the Commission.				
			3.0 It has further been submitted that a report along with a scheme "Revenue enhancement through sale to industries supplied at 33 kV and 132 kV under WBSEDCL through rationalization" was accordingly submitted by WBSEDCL to the Department of Power and NES, Govt. of West Bengal on 26.07.2016. It has been stated further that the said scheme has been approved by the Department of Power and NES, Government of West Bengal and approval conveyed vide their letter dated 25.10.2016 with the direction to move the Commission for the purpose. A copy of the				
			said letter has also been enclosed by WBSEDCL along with their				

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application.

- 4.0 It has been submitted by WBSEDCL that the scheme has been prepared on the basis of tariff order in respect of WBSEDCL for the year 2016-17 and for the DVC 2015-16 keeping effective net rate of WBSEDCL at 50 paise/kWh for 132 kV and 68 paise/kWh for 33 kV more than the effective net rate of respective categories of consumers of DVC at highest performance level (i.e. 100% increased of contractual load / monthly consumption at 89.58% Load Factor).
- 5.0 It has further been submitted that the said scheme will be effective from the date of issue of the order on the said scheme and may continue till issuance of tariff order in respect of WBSEDCL for the year 2017-18. WBSEDCL has prayed before the Commission for according approval to the scheme under Regulation 8.10 of the Tariff Regulations.
- 6.0 The Commission, after due examination of the said proposal along with the scheme submitted by WBSEDCL, is hereby pleased to accord approval to it for implementation of the said scheme subject to the following:-
 - (a) The minimum contractual load for new industries at 33 kV shall be 1.5 MVA instead of 3 MVA as mentioned under item (i) (a) in Annexure II of their proposal.
 - (b) The load factor rebate as proposed in the scheme will be in addition to the rebates already allowed in the Tariff Order in respect of WBSEDCL for 2016-17 for respective categories of consumers.
 - (c) Any loss suffered by WBSEDCL due to implementation of this scheme shall not be passed on through tariff to other categories of consumers.
 - (d) WBSEDCL shall publish a notification in this regard

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> clearly mentioning the rate of rebates and the applicable consumers before introduction of such scheme both in newspaper and website of WBSEDCL.

- (e) The scheme will be effective on and from the consumption month in which the notification will be published.
- (f) WBSEDCL shall also consider any suggestions / objections of any stake holders in this regard and due care should be taken by them.
- 7.0 The application of WBSEDCL is disposed of accordingly. Let a copy of this order be served upon WBSEDCL.

Scheme for revenue enhancement through increased sale to the industries under WBSEDCL through rationalization

It is hereby notified that West Bengal State Electricity Distribution Company Limited (WBSEDCL) is introducing a scheme for revenue enhancement through increased sale to the industries under WBSEDCL.

This scheme is effective from Consumption month of Februray'2017.

- A) Exemption in Demand Charge for additional drawal upto 50% from existing 30% during off peak period for all 33 and 132 KV industrial consumers.
 - To reduce their drawal of load in peak period and to shift the load to off-peak period, rebate allowed to above target consumers for over drawal during off-peak period upto 130% of contract demand in the Tariff Order for 2016-17, has been extended for over drawal during off-peak period upto 150% of contract demand. As such the following rebate equivalent to the difference of the following two will be allowed:
 - i) Demand charge calculated as per regulation 4.3.6 of the Tariff Regulations; and
 - ii) Demand charge computed based on the maximum demand of normal period or maximum demand of peak period or contract demand in case of off-peak period or 85% of contract demand whichever is higher, if those industries keep their maximum demand during off-peak period within 150 % of contract demand.
 - 2. Similarly for the above consumers keeping their maximum demand during off-peak period within 150 % of contract demand, a rebate equivalent to the difference of the following two will also be allowed:
 - i) Additional demand charge calculated as per regulation 4.7.2 of Tariff Regulations; and
 - ii) Demand charge computed based on the methodology for additional demand charge for the normal and peak period will be as per regulation 4.7.2 of Tariff Regulations but there will be no additional demand charge applicable for off-peak period.
 - **3.** Similarly for the above consumers keeping their maximum demand during off-peak period within 150 % of contract demand, a rebate equivalent to the difference of the following two will also be allowed:
 - i) Load factor rebate computed as per the rates mentioned in tariff order without considering the additional kWh and KVA drawn during off-peak period over contractual demand; and
 - ii) Load factor rebate computed as per the rate mentioned in Tariff order following the methodology given in regulation 3.9.2, 3.9.3 and 3.9.4 of the West Bengal West Bengal Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions of Tariff) Regulations, 2011 as amended thereinafter.

B) Extension of additional rebate:

1. Eligibility Condition for Existing Industries:

- i. Load Factor (LF) above 65 % and Contractual Load: 1.5 MVA and above.
- ii. Either Monthly consumption (KWH) should be increased by at least 35 % over base consumption (KWH) or Contractual load shall be increased by at least 35 % over base contractual Load.
- iii. Base consumption is the monthly average consumption of last financial year i.e 2015-16
- iv. Base contractual Load: Contractual load as on 31/03/2016.
- v. For consumer who reduced their contractual load after March'2016 up to the date of effect of relief scheme, are to attain 75% of contractual load as on March 2016 at first to avail the rebate within first six months of commencement of the scheme. In such case the first slab of rebate (i.e. 35% to 50% increase) will be applicable. Such 75% of contractual load as on March 2016 will be the base contractual Load for such consumers on completion of six months time period. Contractual load/ consumption has to be increased further 35% or more over base contractual Load/ consumption to remain eligible for scheme with load factor above 65%. In case of failure to achieve stipulated 35% increase from base load/ consumption or not achieving load factor above 65%, the scheme will be revoked for them and the load factor rebate as per Tariff order will be applicable.
- vi. Payment shall be made within due date

2. Condition for New Industries and revival of closed Industries:

- i. Minimum Contractual load
 - a. For new industries 33 KV: 1.5 MVA and for 132 KV: 7.5 MVA
 - b. For closed industries: the minimum contractual load during the period of last six months before termination/ deemed termination of agreement

Such minimum contractual load will be considered as base contractual load after six months.

- ii. Base consumption: Average consumption of first six month after date of connection excluding disconnection period during first six month.
- iii. Load Factor (LF) above 65 %
- iv. Payment shall be made within due date
- v. After completion of six months from date of connection either Monthly consumption (KWH) should be increased by at least 35 % over base consumption (KWH) or Contractual load shall be increased by at least 35 % over base contractual Load in order to remain eligible for scheme after completion of six months time period. In case of failure to achieve stipulated 35% increase from base load/ consumption or not achieving load factor above 65%, the scheme will be revoked for them and the load factor rebate as per Tariff order will be applicable
